Jarrett Meyer: “Every year the FFA tries to make some sort of improvement at the FFA Farm. This May Term the FFA hopes to complete the newly constructed building with doors and electricity. This will allow the program to open up the farm for many new opportunities for members to house FFA livestock for exhibition. We also hope to be able to purchase either sheep or cattle to allow learning in the classroom and on the farm as well.

Jarrett Meyer: “ We will now have Kade come up and discuss the budget.”

Kade Griesse: “Tonight we would like to outline the chapter expenses and let you know where our much appreciated fundraising dollars are allocated. As noted by

Haley our Fruit Sales Fundraiser is the largest fundraiser we put on each year. With that we send members to the National FFA Convention and Expo in Indianapolis, and also to purchase various chapter activity supplies. Along with Fruit Sales we also host the Annual Homecoming Supper that provides funds for our Operation Feed the Farmers campaign during each harvest season, this provides local farmers with a meal during the busy harvest season. Also we have a smaller fundraiser with Krispy Kremes to pay for our members to attend and compete at our Iowa FFA State Leadership Conference every April. All silent/live auction items we sell tonight help provide funds to pay for tonight's caterer, and any other banquet expenses. The FFA has always had a unique opportunity to have hands on experiences at our FFA farm, all funds that are raised for projects for our property north of town are all done through donations, and available grants. Improvements of the Farm are always trying to be made to enhance the opportunities for our members. General upkeep and maintenance is done by our FFA members, and other volunteers willing to lend a helping hand. All farm improvements are funded through these grants and donations.
